## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Abby Sunderland says she wants to try again to sail around the world solo. The 16-year-old California girl was rescued by a French fishing vessel early Saturday morning. She had been adrift for 3 days in the middle of the Indian Ocean after the mast broke on her small sailboat.

◆ The Obama administration will announce today that all payments from the government will now be made to consumers electronically via direct deposit. The federal government currently spends over \$60 million a year to print and mail paper checks.

◆ A bill making its way through Congress, if passed, would make changes to the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment which grants U.S. citizenship to anyone born on U.S. soil. The bill would grant citizenship to new-borns, only if they have a close relative who's already a U.S. citizen.

◆ Owners of small businesses, mostly "S" Corporations and Professional Corporations, will face a whopping \$11 Billion tax increase starting next year, if legislation now in the House is passed. The proposed legislation will treat all profit as "wages" and subject it to Social Security and Medicare tax. The Senate has already passed it.

#### THIS DAY IN HISTORY-June 14

**1775** - Congress authorized the creation of the U.S. Army. Initially, 10 companies of riflemen were recruited to serve one year.

**1777** - The Continental Congress adopted the flag. June 14, by the way, is Flag Day in the U.S.

**1919** - The first transatlantic airplane flight was made when pilot John William Alcock and his navigator landed their plane in Ireland. They had flown 1960 miles non-stop from Newfoundland in just under 16½ hours.

**1922** - Warren G. Harding became the first president heard on radio, as Baltimore station WEAR broadcast his speech dedicating the Francis Scott Key memorial at Fort McHenry.

**1943** - The Supreme Court ruled schoolchildren could not be compelled to salute the flag of the United States if doing so would conflict with their religious beliefs.

**1954** - President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed an order adding the words "under God" to the Pledge of Allegiance.
