#### **♦ GREENE PICKED AS SCHOOL DIRECTOR**

Robert Greene, Tennessee's Deputy Commissioner of Education, will be the new Athens City Schools Director. The Athens School Board

met in a called meeting last Friday morning and voted to offer the job to Greene, who is a former Meigs County School Superintendent. Greene tentatively accepted the offer and contract negotiations are underway. School Board Chairman Mike Bevins tells The Morning Fax he hopes Greene can be on board by July 26. He will replace Dr. Craig Rigell who has retired.



#### **♦ COUNCIL TO VOTE ON FARMERS MARKET**

The Athens City Council will meet in called session at 5 p.m. tomorrow, June 29. The purpose of the meeting is to vote on a resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Manager to accept a \$100,000 grant and enter into a contract. The city will have to ante-up \$50,000.

# NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ♦ Former Vice President Dick Cheney was taken to a Washington hospital complaining of discomfort. He was given medication to reduce fluid build-up related to his heart disease and was improving. He is expected to be discharged from the hospital today.
- ♦ The longest serving member of Congress, Sen. Robert Byrd, 92, of West Virginia, is said to be seriously ill in a Washington hospital. He was treated for heat exhaustion and dehydration, but other medical problems have developed.
- ♦ In Toronto, almost 600 protesters at the global economic summit have been arrested after they torched police cars and broke hundreds of windows. Security was being provided by an estimated 19,000 law enforcement officers drawn from across Canada, and security costs were estimated at more than US\$900 million.
- ♦ A 6-month-old baby was killed Saturday and her mother injured by a falling tree branch at New York's Central Park Zoo. Police said the 33-year-old New Jersey woman was posing with her baby and her husband was taking their picture when the branch fell.
- ♦ In Lenoir City, a new \$58 million four-lane bridge will be built across Fort Loudon Dam. It will also have two lanes for pedestrians and bicyclists. Construction will start next spring and take 3 years.
