LOCAL & AREA NEWS

◆ FIRES KEEP FIREFIGHTERS BUSY

Three separate fires kept firefighters hopping Tuesday. The first occurred around 2:30 a.m. on Douglas Street in Athens, where a house suffered extensive damage. Firemen said flames were coming from the basement as they arrived. One occupant of the house was treated for smoke inhalation.

The second fire was at the corner of County Roads 802 and 812 when a vacant house caught fire. The Etowah and Englewood Rural Fire Departments responded. Three firefighters were treated for heat exhaustion. The flames caused minor damage

The third fire destroyed a modular home on County Road 250 Tuesday afternoon.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ BP has begun its "static kill" by pumping mud and cement down the throat of the blown-out oil well at the bottom of the Gulf of Mexico.

◆ In Manchester, Connecticut, a warehouse driver who had been asked to resign his job at a beer distributorship went on a shooting rampage Tuesday that left nine people dead, including himself, and several others wounded.

◆ Authorities near Shreveport, Louisiana, say the six teenagers who drowned in the Red River were brothers and sisters from two families. The teens were playing in shallow water when a 15-year-old boy slipped and fell into deeper water. The other teens rushed to help him, but they fell into the deep water as well. None of them knew how to swim.

◆ The Commerce Department says personal spending was unchanged in June, while the personal savings rate rose to 6.4%. That means consumers are saving more and being picky about how they spend their money. Wall Street reacted with the Dow Jones industrial average closing down 38.00 points at 10,636.38.

◆ A New York City agency has cleared the way for construction of a Muslim cultural center near the site of the Sept. 11 attack.
