## LOCAL & AREA NEWS

#### ♦ BIKERS TO PEDAL THROUGH ATHENS

The annual Bicycle Ride Across Tennessee kicked off on Sunday. Riders will spend tonight at Fall Creek Falls State Park and will pedal the 60-miles to Athens tomorrow. The group of bicycle riders will spend the night in Athens and then head out on Wednesday for a 52-mile ride through East Tennessee backroads to Fort Loudoun State Park and the Lost Sea Cave. On Thursday and Friday, the bikers will be in the Tellico Plains, Reliance, Hiwassee River and Ocoee River areas. The ride is sponsored by the Tennessee State Parks Dept.

#### **♦ ELECTRIC CARS ARE ON THE WAY**

The first electric cars, known as the Leaf, will be rolling off the Nissan assembly line in December. A few public charging stations will be available, but most of them will not be ready until next summer. The Leaf will go about 100 miles on a full charge. Fifty "quick chargers" are planned for Nashville, Knoxville, and Chattanooga, and along the interstates between those cities. One will be located in the Athens area. The quick chargers will recharge the Leaf's battery pack to 80% capacity in under 30-minutes. The other public chargers to be installed across the state will take several hours for a full charge.

## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ♦ House Republican leader John Boehner says he would support extending tax cuts only for those earning under \$250,000 a year if it's the only option he has. But he says he considers it "bad policy" and doesn't think it will help the economy to exclude the highest-earning Americans from tax relief during a recession.
- ♦ Secretary of State Hillary Clinton will hold talks this week with the Israeli and Palestinian leaders. She says this may be the last chance for peace between them.
- ♦ Hurricane Igor strengthened to a Category 4 storm in the Atlantic Ocean on Sunday, but poses no immediate threat to land or energy interests.
- ♦ Federal and state investigators say the section of natural gas pipeline that ruptured and exploded in a deadly fireball near San Francisco had been categorized as high risk because it ran through a highly populated area. Last Thursday night's blast and fire devastated a neighborhood, killing at least four and injuring nearly 60.
- ♦ A double-decker bus that may have made a wrong turn off the highway slammed into a low railroad bridge in the pre-dawn darkness near Salina, New York, on Saturday. The crash killed four passengers and critically injured several others.

1788 - Congress authorized the first U.S. national election, to be held the first Wednesday in January 1789.

**1851 -** Surgeon Walter Reed was born. The Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington, D.C., is named for him. 1860 - World War One General John J. "Black Jack" Pershing was born. He was made full general of the armies of the United States. That was the highest rank ever given to a U.S. Army officer.
