♦ BEER SELLERS FACE PENALTIES

The Athens City Council's Beer Board meets tomorrow night and will consider revoking or suspending the beer permits for four Athens convenience stores who were caught in a sting selling beer to minors earlier this year. Two Kangaroo Express stores, the Super Mart, and Stop N Go #2 sold beer to a Monroe County Deputy Sheriff who is under the age of 21, this past April. The four employees and four managers were cited to City Court, where they pled guilty. The owners will appear before the Athens City Beer Board tomorrow night to show cause why the Beer Board should not revoke or suspend their licenses.

♦ WRECK CLAIMS TWO TEENAGERS

Alex Wattenbarger, age 19, and Matthew Martin, age 18, both of Athens, were killed around 9 a.m. Saturday when the 1993 Mazda that Wattenbarger was driving, crashed on County Road 130 near the intersection of County Road 129. According to the THP report, the Mazda was traveling at a high rate of speed, when Wattenbarger lost control and struck a tree on the passenger's side. Both teens were DOA. Trooper Millsaps and Lt. Ruskey investigated the crash.

- ♦ BP's blown-out oil well in the Gulf of Mexico has finally been killed once and for all, five months after an explosion sank a drilling rig and led to the worst offshore oil spill in U.S. history.
- ♦ An American woman, Sarah Shourd, who was held in Iran for more than 13 months and accused of spying, has returned to the U.S. At a news conference, Shourd said that she and her finacé-Shane Bauer, and Josh Fattal, were not spies and had crossed the border into Iran by mistake while they were hiking. Bauer and Fattal are still being held by the Iranians.
- ◆ Intelligence officials say a suspected U.S. missile strike has killed five militants in northwestern Pakistan.
- ♦ The leader of a breakaway religious cult was hospitalized Sunday for a mental evaluation, after members of her group went missing and left behind evidence that they were awaiting the rapture, some catastrophic event, or were planning a mass suicide.
- ♦ A large patriotic rally was held Saturday evening at Athens Regional Park. In the photo, Col.
