♦ DRUG TAKE BACK DAY SCHEDULED

This coming Saturday residents of McMinn County will have an opportunity to safely get rid of expired, unwanted, or unusued prescription drugs from their medicine cabinet. MADCAT (McMinn Anti-Drug Coalition Aiding Teens) is partnering with the Athens Elks Lodge, the Athens Police Department, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Office to "take back" all unwanted pharmaceuticals. From 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. this Saturday, you can take your drugs to the Athens Municipal Building or to the Bi-Lo parking lot in Etowah. Authorities will dispose of the drugs properly. Laura Rust, Community Prevention Organizer with MADCAT, says you need to get rid of old drugs to keep your teenager from taking them. She says you should also keep medications under lock and key and monitor how many pills you have versus how fast they disappear.

♦ TWC ON FINANCIAL "WATCH LIST"

Tennessee Wesleyan College is one of four private colleges in Tennessee to be placed on the government's list of colleges that failed to meet federal financial standards. As a result, TWC has had to provide a bank letter of credit showing it has the assets to cover the amount of federal institutional aid awarded to students. Interim President Stan Harrison says endowment revenue has dropped substantially in recent years. However, Harrison says the college is running a positive budget and enrollment is good this year. Harrison says TWC remains financially viable and he expects the college to come off the fiscal watch list by the year 2012.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ A group that dates the beginning and end of recessions says the latest recession ended in June 2009. The National Bureau of Economic Research says it started in December 2007 and lasted 18 months, making it the longest downturn since the Great Depression of the 1930's. However, word that the recession is over may not be much consolation to people who are still out of work and whose homes are still being foreclosed.
- ♦ Stocks extended their September rally into a fourth week Monday as investors hoped for more moves by the Federal Reserve to improve the economy. The Dow Jones Industrials Average closed up 145.77 points at 10,753.62.
- ♦ Hurricane Igor churned north on Monday on a track expected to take it near Newfoundland in easternmost Canada. Igor battered Bermuda with heavy winds, waves, and rain that caused damage but no casualties.
- ♦ A Kentucky man who is accused of strangling his wife plans to claim excessive caffeine from sodas, energy drinks and diet pills left him so mentally unstable that he could not have knowingly killed her.
