♦ GROUND SHAKES NEAR SWEETWATER

A small earthquake shook the ground about one mile southeast of Sweetwater shortly before 8 p.m. Tuesday. The quake measured 2.1 on the Richter Scale. There were no reports of damage. Small earthquakes are fairly common due to a fault line running through East Tennessee.

♦ ATHENS FIREMEN MAKE 57 RUNS IN AUG.

The Athens Fire Department made 57 runs during August. That compares to 43 in July. There were three residential fires with total damage of \$128,000 and four commercial fires with damage totaling \$159,200. \$144,000 of that was the fire that destroyed the Country Patch restaurant on South White Street. Firefighters also responded to seven vehicle accidents, 16 false alarms, and several vehicle fires and trash fires. Other calls involved such things as a natural gas leak, a downed power line, unauthorized burning, and several calls to assist ambulance personnel in lifting patients. The total damage for August was \$287,700, compared to \$40,500 in July.


- ♦ European security officials warn of an active terror plot to wage attacks in Britain, France, and Germany. Officials say the plot is still in its early stages and not considered serious enough to raise the current terror threat level. Even so, the Eiffel Tower in Paris was briefly evacuated on Tuesday for the second time in a week because of an unspecified threat.
- ♦ Former President Jimmy Carter spent a second night in an Ohio hospital for additional medical observation after being whisked from an airplane to an emergency room after suffering an upset stomach while flying from Atlanta to Cleveland.
- ♦ Tropical Storm Nicole skirted to the east of Florida on Wednesday as it headed toward the Bahamas. At least one death was recorded due to flooding in Jamaica.
- ♦ Stocks were little changed Wednesday as investors neared the end of one of the best months for stocks in 20 years. The Dow Jones Industrials Average closed at 10,835.28; down 22.86 points.
- ◆ The U.S. government has apologized for flying the Philippine flag upside down at an event in New York attended by President Obama, calling it an "honest mistake."
