NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ A judge in New York has barred prosecutors from calling their star witness at the first civilian trial of a Guantanamo Bay detainee. Prosecutors say Hussein Abebe's testimony is vital to their case, because he would tell the jury how he came to sell explosives to Ahmed Khalfan Ghailani, who is accused of being a bomb-maker and an aide to Osama bin Laden.
- ♦ Texas Governor Rick Perry has told Mexico's president to call him within 48 hours to say that the body of an American reportedly shot to death on a border lake has been recovered. Tiffany Hartley of Colorado says her husband was shot by Mexican pirates while they were riding their jet skis. Mexican officials don't believe her story.
- The American Civil Liberties Union claims in a lawsuit that a North Carolina school violated the constitutional rights of a 14-yearold student by suspending her for wearing a nose piercing.
- ♦ A new study shows hands-only CPR can save more lives. Giving continuous chest presses simulates a heartbeat. The authors of the study say anyone who can put one hand on top of the other, lock their elbows, and push hard and fast can do CPR with no risk or fear of causing harm. The authors say they want to take away all the reasons bystanders do nothing when they witness another person collapse.

Murder Conviction Upheld

The Tennessee Supreme Court has upheld the death sentence of H.R. Hester, who was found guilty of murdering Charles Haney, 77, in December of 1999. Hester's ex-wife, Dora Mae Hester, was Haney's caretaker. Hester went to their mobile home and asked her for \$10 dollars to buy beer. When she refused, he tied them up, poured kerosene on them, and set the mobile home on fire. Haney died. Hester's ex-wife managed to escape, but suffered severe burns which led to the double amputation of her lower legs. Hester was found guilty and sentenced to death. He appealed the conviction on several grounds, but this week the Supreme Court rejected his arguments. His execution date was set for October 11, 2010.
