NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ In Chile, rescue workers will begin the process of evacuating 33 trapped miners late Tuesday night. Officials say it will take 48 hours to get all the men hoisted up, one at a time, from inside the caved-in mine half-a-mile underground.
- ♦ A new report on global hunger says 29 countries show alarming levels of hunger and more than a billion people were hungry in 2009. Most of the countries with hungry people are in sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia.
- ♦ Stocks edged higher on Monday on expectations that the Federal Reserve will bolster the economic recovery by injecting more cash into the economy. The Dow Jones Industrials Average closed at 11,010.34; up 3.86 points.
- ♦ Virgin Galactic is on track to fly paying passengers into space. Virgin Galactic's space tourism rocket known as SpaceShipTwo made its first solo glide flight over the Mojave Desert this past Sunday. The craft was carried aloft by its mothership and then glided from an altitude of 45,000 feet. Several more test flights will be made before the company can begin flying passengers. Tickets are \$200,000. Some 370 customers have paid deposits totaling \$50 million.
