STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

♦ EARLY VOTING STARTS TODAY

Early voting for the November 2nd election starts today and continues through October 28. In McMinn County early voting will take place in the Election Commission office in the Courthouse Annex. The hours will be Monday-Thursday, 8:30 am to 4 pm; Fridays, 8:30 am to 6 pm; and Saturdays, 8:30 am to 12 noon. The McMinn County ballot will include races for Governor, State Senate, State Representative, and a constitutional amendment affirming that citizens of Tennessee have the right to hunt and fish. Depending on your voting precinct, the ballot will also include races for the Athens City Council and the Athens School Board, Calhoun City Commission, or Niota Mayor and City Commission.

√ The Athens Parks Foundation will hold the dedication of holes 1 through 9 of the Athens Regional Park Disc Golf Course this Thursday at 5:30 pm. The dedication will take place in the field behind the red brick house on the right as you enter the park. There will also be demonstrations of distance throwing and putting.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ♦ The Obama administration says it is lifting the six-month moratorium on deepwater oil drilling in the Gulf of Mexico that was imposed after the BP oil rig spill.
- ♦ Hurricane Paula was nearing the coast of Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula Tuesday night. Earlier, Paula smashed homes and forced schools to close in Honduras.
- ♦ The head of the National Republican Senatorial Committee, Rob Jesmer, for the first time is saying that a GOP takeover of the Senate is possible in the November 2 elections.
- ♦ The latest Rasmussen report shows Republican Bill Haslam is leading the race for Tennessee governor with almost a two-to-one lead over Democrat Mike McWherter. The poll also shows that 63% of the Tennesseans surveyed want to repeal the Obama national health care bill passed last spring.
- White House press secretary Robert Gibbs says President Obama is not backing off his charge that the U.S. Chamber of Commerce is using foreign money to fund some of its campaign ads.
- ♦ On Wall Street the Dow Jones Industrials Average was up again on Tuesday. The Dow closed at 11,020.40; up 10.06 points.
