♦ FIVE DIE IN HIGHWAY 68 CRASH

Five people from Madisonville, including an unborn baby, were killed in a fiery head-on collision on Highway 68 at County Road 292 in McMinn County last Friday afternoon. A red Dodge Neon driven by Christan Wagner, 20, crossed the center line and struck a Wal-Mart truck head-on. Wagner, who was pregnant, died along with her unborn baby. Her front seat passenger, 25-year-old Michael Shell died along with his two children, 2-year-old Michael Shell, Jr., and 11-month-old Adrian Damion Shell. Trooper Rick Ray says the adults were not wearing seat belts and the children's child restraints were

not properly installed. The truck driver was not injured.

NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL NEWS

- ♦ Iraq's highest court has ordered parliament back to work after a seven-month political impasse that has blocked the formation of a new government.
- ♦ A string of beaches on California's central coast have been shut down after a deadly weekend attack on a body-boarder from what authorities say was probably a great white shark.
- ♦ Hurricane Richard lashed Honduras' Caribbean coast with heavy rain, then roared toward Belize and southeastern Mexico.
- ♦ Health workers in Haiti are trying to keep a cholera outbreak from spreading from rural areas to the earthquake survivor camps in the capital, Port-au-Prince.
- ♦ The federal government will issue new fuel efficiency rules today that require future tractor-trailers, school buses, delivery vans, garbage trucks, and heavy-duty pickup trucks to reduce fuel consumption by 20% beginning in 2014.
- ♦ Singer Celine Dion gave birth to twin boys at a hospital in West Palm Beach, Florida, on Saturday. Dion, who is 42, had undergone in-vitro fertilization to help her conceive.
- ♦ The Vols lost to Alabama, 41-10, on Saturday. The Tide scored three touchdowns in the third quarter.

- ♦ Athens police arrested Nathan Dean Charles, 25, after finding explosives and a meth lab inside his car and his residence. Police were called to the Valley Mart on South Congress Parkway early Saturday to deal with an intoxicated man, who turned out to be Charles. Police say Charles had a small amount of suspected meth on him. Officers found a meth lab, a stolen shotgun, and a box of blasting caps in his vehicle. The Cleveland Police Department's bomb squad was called to dispose of the blasting caps. Then, they went to Charles' residence on View Street, where they found liquid explosives and another meth lab. Charles faces multiple charges, including possession of prohibited weapons, possession of a stolen weapon, and possession of meth and drug paraphernalia.
- ♦ The owner of the Econo Lodge in Sweetwater is upset over her motel being listed on a website that tracks alleged bed bug encounters. The website, www.bedbugregistry.com, lists 119 Tennessee hotels with reported bed bug sightings. Pam Kshatriya says she has never had any reports of bed bug bites from people who have stayed at the Econo Lodge. She tells The Morning Fax that she has contacted the website to try to have her motel removed from the list.
- ♦ McMinn County Mayor John Gentry has a new assistant. Mark Cochran of Englewood has been hired to replace Joe Guy, who was elected Sheriff. Cochran is a 2004 graduate of McMinn Central and has been a staff assistant for Senator Bob Corker in Corker's Washington office.


