#### ♦ TEN MILE MAN DIES IN MEIGS CRASH

A Ten Mile man died in a one-vehicle traffic crash on Highway 58 in north Meigs County Wednesday morning. The Tennessee Highway Patrol identifies the victim as Roger E. Sitzlar. Troopers say his vehicle ran off the roadway near the Roane County line and traveled approximately 50 feet before striking a large tree. He was pronounced dead on the scene.

## **NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS**

◆ Republican leaders in Congress vow to roll back the size of government and challenge President Obama's health care law. Rep. John Boehner of Ohio, who will be the new House Speaker, describes Tuesday's elections as a mandate to shrink the government. Democrats lost control of the House and lost seats in the Senate. The results are seen as a repudiation of Obama's agenda. Even Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, who survived a TEA Party challenge in Nevada, says he is ready for some "tweaking" on the health care law. President Obama says voters were frustrated by the pace of economic recovery and says he takes responsibility for failing to restore job growth more quickly.

• California voters rejected a proposal that would have made their state the first to legalize marijuana for recreational use.

• The Federal Reserve says it will buy \$600 billion worth of government bonds in an attempt to breathe new life into the struggling economy. On Wall Street, the Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 11,215.13; up 26.41 points.

• French police say an 18-month-old boy survived a fall from an 8th floor window of a Paris apartment by bouncing off an awning and into someone's arms.
