♦ WHAT REALLY HAPPENED ON THE BUS?

Students on a Meigs County school bus complained last week that their driver was speeding and driving recklessly. One parent said he could hear children screaming and crying when his son called him from the bus. Several parents called 911 about the bus driving recklessly. However, an investigation by school officials and police reveal a completely different story. After watching surveillance video, Director of Schools Don Roberts says he supports the bus driver. The video does not show the bus was speeding, but it does show that some of the older kids on the bus were acting up. The school system cleared the driver of any wrongdoing, but barred two high school students from riding the bus.

♦ JAIL ESCAPEE CAPTURED IN SO. CAROLINA

An escapee from the Monroe County Jail, Christopher Chittum, and the woman who allegedly drove the getaway car have been arrested in Charleston, South Carolina. When he escaped, Chittum was in jail for robbing the Hampton Inn in Athens. He and the woman, Samantha Stafford, will be returned to Monroe County. Stafford will be charged with facilitating Chittum's escape.

♦ The head of the transportation Security Administration acknowledges that new full-body scanners and thorough pat-downs can be invasive and uncomfortable, but he says the need to stay a step ahead of terrorists rules out changes in airport screening procedures.

• The Taliban is vowing to force the U.S.-led coalition to leave Afghanistan before a 2014 date set by the alliance for handing over security responsibility to the Afghan forces.

• The European Union finance ministers have agreed to an emergency bailout loan to help Ireland's struggling banks.

• Former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee says Iowa voters sent a national message on November 2nd by ousting three state Supreme Court justices who ruled in 2009 to legalize gay marriage in Iowa.

♦ In college football, the UT Vols defeated Vanderbilt, 24-10, last Saturday night. Despite the win, Coach Derek Dooley said the Vols "stink at running the ball." He said the team made enough mistakes in the game to last a season. This week's AP college football rankings have Oregon #1, Auburn #2, Boise State #3, and TCU is ranked in 4th place.
