♦ SHINE YOUR LIGHT FOR SAFETY

The Tennessee Highway Patrol is urging motorists to drive with their headlights on during the Thanksgiving Holiday. The headlights will show your commitment to safe driving, seat belt usage, and traffic law complaince. State Troopers will be assigned to every 10-mile stretch of Interstate 40. Ten people were killed in crashes on Tennessee roads during the 2009 Thanksgiving Holiday. Five of the victims were not wearing seat belts. The victims also included two pedestrians and one motorcyclist. The THP will be conducting driver license and sobriety checkpoints across the state. A sobriety checkpoint will take place Friday night at Highway 411 and the Ace Hardware Store in Etowah.

♦ HOLIDAY SCHEDULES ANNOUNCED

The Athens Municipal Building and the Public Works Department will be closed this Thursday and Friday. The Recycling Center will be closed Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Thursday's residential garbage will be picked up next Monday, Nov. 29th, and Friday's garbage will be collected on Tuesday, Nov. 30th. If you have extra garbage bags that will not fit into the totes, simply set the bags next to the tote and an extra truck will pick them up the day of your scheduled pick-up.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- With the busiest travel day of the year coming up tomorrow, the Obama administration's top transportation security official is urging passengers not to boycott airport body scanners. John Pistole says a protest over body scans will only serve to tie up people who want to go home to see their loved ones.
- ♦ Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, who is not subject to security pat-downs when she travels, says she would not go through such scrutiny if she could avoid it. Meantime, a bladder cancer survivor from Michigan who wears a bag that collects his urine says a security agent at a Detroit airport patted him down so roughly, it caused the bag to spill its contents on his clothing and left him in tears.
- ◆ The U.S. Energy Department says government agents hired to drive trucks carrying nuclear weapons and components got drunk while on convoy missions. In one case, two agents were detained by police at a bar during one of those missions.
- ◆ Police in Los Angeles are investigating the death of a 2-year-old boy who fell 50 feet from a luxury suite after a Lakers game at the Staples Center.
- ♦ On Wall Street, the DJIA closed at 11,178.58; down 24.97.

1804 - Our 14th President, Franklin Pierce, was born in New Hampshire. He became the first Democratic president since James K. Polk and campaigned on the slogan, "We Polked you in 1844...we shall Pierce you in 1852."

1859 - William Bonney was born in New York City. He was better known as "Billy the Kid," a notorious cattle rustler and killer in the Wild West.
