As an alternative, Athens residents may place your tree curbside and they will be picked up through Friday. Be sure to remove all ornaments, hangers, lights, and stands. Anyone wishing to obtain free bags of wood mulch during "Sharing of the Green" can come by the Athens Recycle Center this Saturday from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Mulch will be available on a first come/first served basis.

√ The Autism Support Group of McMinn County will hold its monthly meeting this Thursday at 7 p.m. at Mars Hill Presbyterian Church on N. Jackson St. in Athens. Signal Centers will present the program. Childcare will be provided. For more information, call 506-2868.

√ The Athens City Council invites the public to attend a Citizens Forum on January 11th at 5:30 p.m. at the Athens Regional Park Conference Center. The purpose of the forum is to receive comments from citizens about any issue dealing with the City of Athens and to provide information to the public concerning the fiscal condition of the city, present projects, and services. The event is expected to last between one and two hours.

### NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ Stocks started 2011 on an up-note thanks to better news about the economy. Manufacturing activity and construction spending both rose more than analysts were predicting. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 11,670.75; up 93.24 points.

◆ Top Senate Democrats are warning House Speaker-elect John Boehner they will block any Republican effort to repeal President Obama's health care overhaul. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid says repeal of health care would have "unintended consequences" for the part of the health care law that provides better Medicare prescription drug coverage.

◆ New York City is picking up garbage for the first time since the blizzard hit a week ago. The Christmas weekend blizzard dumped 20 inches of snow on the city.

◆ A man who jumped out of a 9th-floor window in New York on Sunday is alive thanks to the fact that the city's garbage has gone uncollected. The 26-year-old man landed in a giant heap of trash. The trash bags broke his fall. He is hospitalized in critical but stable condition.

◆ Pharmaceutical giant *Johnson and Johnson* says it is partnering with doctors to improve a test to detect cancer cells in the blood in hopes of one day making it available in doctor's offices. The technology is known as Circulating Tumor Cell microchip. It's touted as a revolutionary approach toward diagnosing cancer.
