STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

♦ METH BUSTS LEAD TO EXPLOSIVE DEVICE

Federal agents with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives and members of the Chattanooga Bomb Squad were summoned to McMinn County to dispose of a large military ammunition round that measured 30mm by 173mm. The device was found at the home of Rodney Swafford on County Road 53. Swafford contacted the Sheriff's Department and told them he had taken James Wyatt into custody. Wyatt was wanted in a shooting incident which occured in Meigs County last week. While at the home of Swafford, deputies discovered two meth labs, several firearms, and surveillance cameras. Sheriff Joe Guy says it was one of the largest meth operations ever discovered in McMinn County. Another meth lab was discovered last week at the home of Ricky McNelley on County Road 198. McNelley was arrested and charged with meth manufacturing, theft of two stolen ATV's and several firearms.

NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL NEWS

- ♦ Republicans say they want to hear less, when the President gives his State of the Union Address Tuesday night; less spending, less government, and less debt, to solve the country's financial problems.
- ♦ Tea partiers clamoring for the debt-ridden government to slash spending say nothing should be off limits and they're not exempting the military's multibillion-dollar budget during a time of war.
- ♦ A North Carolina woman who raised a child kidnapped 23 years ago from a New York hospital surrendered to authorities on a parole violation charge Sunday, days after a widely publicized reunion between the biological mother and the baby daughter taken from her.
- ♦ Investigators have been poring over surveillance video, interviewing witnesses and analyzing items seized from Jared Loughner's home as they build a case in the assassination attempt against Rep. Gabrielle Giffords.
- ♦ Meanwhile, Rep. Giffords was transferred to a hospital in Houston over the weekend. Giffords has a buildup of fluid in her brain and that will keep her in intensive care for several more days. Assuming that improves, she will be transferred to TIRR or The Institute for Rehabilitation and Research in Houston.
