## State & Local News

### ◆ RISK IS RAISED AT AREA NUCLEAR PLANTS

The Sequoyah Nuclear Plant near Soddy-Daisy is ranked number four on the list of U.S. nuclear power sites with the highest risk of major damage from an earthquake. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has recalculated the odds of a major earthquake based on the latest geological data. The chances of a core-damaging earthquake at the Sequoyah Plant is now about 1-in-20,000. The new risk estimate is 420% higher than the previous estimate. The Watts Bar Nuclear Plant is ranked number 14, with a 1-in-28,000 chance of core damage from an earthquake. That's an increase of 543% from the previous estimate. The odds take into consideration two major factors: the chance of a serious quake and the strength of the plant's design. The reactor with the highest risk in the U.S. is the Indian Point Nuclear Plant located 24 miles north of New York City. There is a 1-in-10,000 chance that the core could be damaged by an earthquake.

### ◆ CHEROKEES GET BOUNCED FROM TOURNAMENT

Bearden High School ended the hopes of the McMinn County Cherokees yesterday when they defeated the Tribe 76-48 in the first round of the state AAA basketball tournament. It was the first appearance for the Cherokees at the state level in 20 years. The Cherokees end their 2010-2011 basketball season at 24-11.

## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ President Obama has asked nuclear regulators to make a comprehensive review of the safety of U.S. nuclear plants in light of the disaster in Japan. Obama also says harmful levels of radiation are not expected to reach the West Coast, Hawaii, Alaska, or the U.S. territories in the Pacific. In Japan, emergency workers are using water cannons, heavy-duty firetrucks, and military helicopters to drop water onto their damaged reactors.

◆ U.S. stocks advanced on Thursday, bouncing back after three days of declines, as investors searched for bargains. Economic bellwether FedEx, the world's largest cargo airline, forecast improved revenue, boosted by strong demand. The Dow Jones industrial average closed at 11,774.59, up 161.29.

◆ Secretary of State Hillary Clinton says she does not want to remain in her job if President Obama wins a second term in 2012. She also says she has no plans to run for president and has no interest in other posts, such as vice president or defense secretary.

◆ Actress Sandra Bullock has donated \$1 million towards the earthquake and tsunami relief efforts in Japan. She gave the money to the American Red Cross.

◆ The New York Times will begin charging people to access some of its digital content as it makes another stab at getting readers to pay for on-line news. Subscribers to the print edition will have full access to the paper's Website for free. Everyone else can read 20 articles for free each month before they have to start paying.

◆ Diet Coke has topped rival Pepsi-Cola for the first time to become the second most popular soft drink behind Coca-Cola.
