STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

◆ POLICE SEEK BURGLARY SUSPECT

McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy is asking the public for help in locating a suspect in numerous home burglaries in the McMinn County area. He is 32-year-old James "Jamie" Stewart Durance. (See photo) Sheriff Guy says he commonly knocks to see if anyone is home. If a homeowner answers the door, he indicates he is "looking for someone" and leaves. If no one answers the knock, he then burglarizes the residence. Anyone with information about his whereabouts should call the Sheriff's office at 745-5620. Sheriff Guy also says a burglary suspect was arrested Monday after being surprised by a homeowner on County Road 350. He's identified as Richard Wayne Stewart, age 45.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ House Speaker John Boehner says private talks with President Obama failed to produce a deal to avoid a government shutdown. Unless an agreement can be reached to cover the rest of the budget year, Boehner says House Republicans want a stop-gap bill that will keep the government running for one more week and slash another \$12 billion in spending. Friday is the deadline to avoid a shutdown.

◆ The operator of Japan's crippled nuclear power plant says it had reduced the flow of highly radioactive water out of a reactor. That is seen as a possible sign of progress in a month-long battle to contain the world's biggest nuclear disaster in 25 years.

◆ U.S. stocks fell on Tuesday despite the news that Texas Instruments has offered to buy National Semiconductor in a deal worth \$6.5 billion. NS's stock shot-up 9.95 per share. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 12,393.90; down 6.13 points.

◆ Authorities were searching Tuesday evening for two workers missing after a wastewater treatment plant failure in Gatlingburg, TN, spilled millions of gallons of sewage. The Tennessee Emergency Management Agency says a holding tank failed Tuesday and between 1½ and 3 million gallons of sewage spilled; much of it entering the Little Pigeon River.
