◆ TWO PEOPLE HURT IN HIGHWAY 411 CRASH

Two people were transported to Woods Memorial Hospital Memorial Day night with non-life threatening injuries following a two-vehicle crash on Highway 411 South near the Bellevue Estates subdivision. Police say Bryan Spurling of Benton was driving southbound when he veered to the right and hit a 2011 Ford Fiesta driven by Brenda Hutton Dayton, forcing her into the guardrail. Spurling was charged with DUI and driving without a valid license. He and a male passenger in the Fiesta were taken to Woods. NATIONAL-WORLD

- ◆ House Republicans defeated a \$2.4 trillion increase in the nation's debt limit Tuesday night; designed to reinforce a demand for the president to cut spending before any increase in government borrowing takes place.
- ◆ President Hamid Karzai is warning NATO-led forces in Afghanistan that they are at risk of being seen as an occupying force rather than an ally if they don't stop air strikes on Afghan homes.
- ◆ Two Iraqis have been indicted in Bowling Green, Kentucky, on federal terrorism charges, including allegations that they provided support to Al-Qaeda in Iraq and conspired to transport Stinger missiles overseas.
- ◆ An international panel of experts says cellphones are possibly carcinogenic to humans. After reviewing dozens of published studies, the International Agency for Research on Cancer classified cellphones in the same category that includes the pesticide DDT and gasoline engine exhaust.
- ◆ Four people were killed and dozens injured in a bus crash early Tuesday on I-95 in Virginia. Police attribute the Sky Express Bus crash to driver fatigue and say charges are pending.
- ◆ The former head of a major Egyptian bank has been charged with sexually assaulting a hotel maid at a New York City hotel.

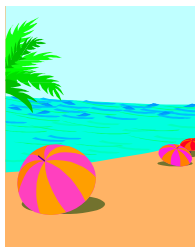
