◆ FEDERAL JURY CONVICTS HUFF

A federal jury in Knoxville has convicted a Georgia man in a plot to seize the Monroe County Courthouse with people who disputed President Obama's U.S. citizenship. Darren Wesley Huff was found guilty of carrying a firearm in interstate commerce with the intent to use it in a civil disorder. He was arrested in 2010 after telling officers he brought his firearms to Madisonville from Georgia to support efforts to make citizens' arrests of the Monroe County grand jury foreman and other officials.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Rick Perry has unveiled his tax and spending plan which he calls his "cut, balance, and grow" plan. It proposes an optional 20% flat tax rate, allowing taxpayers to submit their taxes on a postcard. The new flat rate preserves mortgage interest and exemptions for charitable donations. It also drops the corporate tax rate to 20%, ends taxes on Social Security, and eliminates the death tax.
- ◆ A Center for Disease Control and Prevention advisory committee is recommending that all males starting at age 11 should receive the HPV vaccine to protect themselves against sexually transmitted forms of cervical, anal, mouth, and throat cancers. The CDC already recommends routinely immunizing girls for HPV beginning at age 11 or 12.
- ◆ Researchers have found that gas pump handles are the filthiest surface that Americans encounter on their way to work. The Kimberly-Clark study shows other top offenders are handles on public mailboxes, escalator rails, and ATM buttons.
- ◆ Police in Oakland, California, cleared an anti-Wall Street protest early Tuesday. The mayor and police chief in Atlanta are threatening to do the same thing.
- ◆ UT football coach Derek Dooley says freshman quarterback Justin Worley will start Saturday against South Carolina.

The Drug Take Back will be this coming Saturday between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the parking lot of the police station at the Athens Municipal Building, at the Bi-Lo parking lot in Etowah, and at the police headquarters in Niota.

All drugs that are surrendered will be taken to a central location for incineration. The goal in McMinn County is to receive 100 pounds of pills. This would be a great time to clean out the medicine cabinet or the cupboards and dispose of all out-of-date and unused prescriptions.
