NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Riot police have shielded Greece's national parliament as demonstrators protest against austerity measures on the eve of talks in Brussels on a 130-billion-euro (\$171 billion) bailout needed to avert bankruptcy.
- ◆ Iran's oil ministry has stopped selling crude to British and French companies, in a retaliatory measure against fresh EU sanctions on the Islamic state's lifeblood, oil.
- ◆ Revelations that Google Inc, Twitter and other popular Internet companies have been taking liberties with customer data have prompted criticism from privacy advocates and lawmakers, along with apologies from the companies.
- ◆ Hundreds of Russians protesting against Vladimir Putin drove through Moscow Sunday ahead of the March 4 presidential election expected to seal his grip on power.
- ◆ Republican presidential candidate Rick Santorum has challenged President Barack Obama's Christian beliefs, saying White House policies were motivated by a "different theology."
- ◆ Tee Martin, who led Tennessee to the 1999 BCS Championship, is leaving the University of Kentucky as a wide receiver coach and is joining the staff of former U.T. Coach Lane Kiffin at USC.
