State & Local News

◆ MEET TWC DAY WELL ATTENDED

Over 60 business, individuals, and groups visited the Tennessee Wesleyan College Campus on Wednesday to meet the school's new and returning students. Air-EVAC medical helicopter also visited the campus, landing on the Wesley Commons Lawn. Ian Cullen, one of our MORN-ING FAX readers, sent us the photo. Meanwhile, U.S. News & World Report has listed TWC as a top tier regional college in their new 2013 edition of "Best Colleges" in the U.S.



◆ AUB RELEASES NEW RATE INFORMATION

The per kilowatt hour rate for AUB power will decrease in October versus September as summer rates transition to the fall season. AUB says a residential customer that uses 1350 kw hours in September will pay \$4.70 less in October for the same amount of power.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ A security breach by 3 elderly protesters at the Y-12 nuclear weapons plant in Oak Ridge, at what was supposed to be one of the most secure facilities in the United States, has raised new questions about a plan to overhaul the way the government oversees its nuclear laboratories and weapons plants.

◆ President Obama says that Chris Stevens, the U.S. ambassador to Libya, who was killed along with three others in a rocket attack on the American Consulate in Benghazi, Libya, was "a courageous and exemplary representative of the United States." The slain embassy staffers were trying to flee the consulate building that was under assault by protesters apparently angry over a new Hollywood film they say insults the Prophet Muhammad.

◆ The President has ordered 50 Marines to Libya to safeguard American personnel and critical facilities there, and ordered a worldwide review of security at diplomatic posts. The moves were made amid escalating worries that a deadly attack on the U.S. Consulate in Benghazi stemmed from a carefully planned extremist plot and not from a spontaneous riot.

◆ Tony Perkins, the President of the Family Research Council, says that enthusiasm among social conservatives for Mitt Romney's presidential campaign is still "building." Perkins, who endorsed former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum during the Republican primaries says he now supports Governor Romney.

- ◆ The Knoxville Police Department is telling Vol football fans that anyone who comes onto the field will be arrested and charged with aggravated criminal trespassing. KPD says they are taking a "pro-active" stance before this Saturday's big game between Tennessee and Florida. ESPN's Gameday will be broadcasting from Knoxville on Saturday, the first time the cable network has been at a Tennessee game in four years. The game is "sold-out".
- ◆ The Diocese of Nashville, along with seven other Catholic entities in Middle Tennessee, are suing the federal government over the contraceptive mandate in "Obamacare, because it violates the groups' Catholic beliefs by forcing them to provide services they find "morally objectionable."

THIS DAY IN HISTORY-Sept. 13

- 1788** - Congress authorized the first national election, to be held the first Wednesday in January 1789.
- 1851** - Surgeon Walter Reed was born. The Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington was named after him.
- 1911** - The "father" of bluegrass, Bill Monroe, was born. His hits included "Blue Moon Of Kentucky," "Uncle Pen," and "Kentucky Waltz."
- 1922** - The temperature at El Azizia, Libya, reached 136 degrees Farenheit. That is generally accepted as the world's highest recorded temperature.
- 1925** - Singer Mel Torme was born. He wrote the popular Christmas song titled "The Christmas Song" about those chestnuts roasting on an open fire. Nat King Cole's recording made the song a Christmas classic.
- 1960** - The Federal Communications Commission banned payola after a scandal erupted involving radio station DJ's who accepted gifts and money from record promoters for playing certain recordings over the air.
