◆ PROPERTY TAX NOTICES HAVE ARRIVED

◆ STATE AGENCY SQUANDERS TAXPAYER FUNDS

Justin P. Wilson, the Comptroller for the State of Tennessee, has issued an audit which says that the Upper Cumberland Human Resource Agency has spent around \$2 million for travel expenses, lavish meals and liquor, entertainment, mobile communications devices, and other questionable items. NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Two military fighter jets were scrambled over central New Jersey after two aircraft violated airspace restrictions in place because of the U.N. General Assembly meeting in New York City.

◆ In what could be his last speech to the annual U.N. General Assembly, President Barack Obama stood on the world stage Tuesday and warned Iran that the United States will "do what we must" to stop Tehran from getting a nuclear weapon.

◆ Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu has relentlessly warned that Iran poses an imminent nuclear threat, but most people in Israel don't seem concerned, believing it won't happen or that Israel can handle it.

◆ U.S. home prices rose for a sixth straight month in July in the latest sign of a sustainable housing market recovery. Six years after its collapse, economists believe the housing market has turned a corner.

◆ A quiet day on Wall Street turned into the worst sell-off in three months after a Federal Reserve official said he doubted the bank's effort to boost economic growth would work.

◆ American Airlines says its planes are being grounded because of aircraft maintenance concerns and a high number of pilots calling in sick.

◆ Two CBS affiliate radio stations in Los Angeles, KNX and KFWB, were evacuated on Tuesday morning after police were called to investigate a "ticking or beeping" package in their lobby.

◆ The NFL upheld the Seahawks' disputed 14-12 win over the Green Bay Packers Monday night and resumed meetings with its locked-out officials in an attempt to resolve an impasse that has prompted torrents of criticism against the replacement refs.
