## Local and State News

### ◆ ARMED ROBBERY IN BROAD DAYLIGHT

Armed robbers held-up the Athens "Check In To Cash" store shortly after 12 noon on Saturday. The robbers were spotted running from the front door of the business and managed to escape.

### ◆ TWO POSSIBLE MURDERS IN MONROE CO.

The Monroe County Sheriff's Department investigated a shooting in Tellico Plains on Friday. Officers found the body of a 38-year-old woman at a home on Towee Falls Road. Evidence indicated some type of drug activity was involved. Her identity was not released. Meanwhile, the TBI is investigating a possible homicide after a body was discovered in the lake at Kefauver Park in Madisonville Sunday afternoon. An autopsy is being conducted to determine the cause of death and identify the body.

## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Supporters and opponents of Egypt's president grew more entrenched in their potentially destabilizing battle over the Islamist leader's move to assume near absolute powers, with neither side appearing willing to back down as the Egyptian stock market plunged amid the fresh turmoil.

◆ A new "rule book" is being prepared at the White House concerning those terrorists placed on a "kill list" for unmanned drone strikes. Until now, the President has had the final authority on who should be targeted. Since President Obama took office in 2009, there have been more than 300 drone strikes carried out by the U.S. military.

◆ Fire raced through a Bangladesh garment factory that supplies Wal-Mart and other major retailers in the West, killing at least 112 people, many of whom were trapped by the flames because the eight-story building lacked emergency exits. A dozen other people that jumped from the building, died at nearby hospitals.

◆ In Springfield, Mass. a natural gas explosion that injured 18 people, destroyed a strip club, and damaged 41 other buildings, was blamed on a utility worker who accidentally punctured a high-pressure pipeline while looking for a leak. No one was killed.

The Vols ended their third straight losing season with a record of 5 wins and 7 losses. Auburn coach Gene Chizik was fired Saturday night after losing to Alabama 49 to 0. Chizik won the national championship 2 years ago. The Titans lost to the Jacksonville Jaguars 24 to 19.
