Local and State News

◆ SHERIFF'S DEPT. HITS A GRAND SLAM

Sheriff Joe Guy says that his department executed a search warrant last Friday, at a home at 424 C.R. 571 near Englewood, and busted a sizeable meth manufacturing operation. Officers found 36 meth "shake bottles", a chemical gas generator, 135 grams of pseudoephedrine, several gallons of acid, as well as mass quantities of other items used to make meth. Guy said that officers also found other controlled substances such as alprazolam, oxycodone, and methadone. Various items of stolen property worth over \$10,000, including a motorcycle, were located at the scene. Arrested in relation to the search warrant were: Charles "Chaz" Miller of C.R. 571, on meth & theft; Brian Allen Myers of Niota, failure to appear & theft; Richard Kelsey Clark of Athens, federal weapons indictment; & Jeremy Scott Ledbetter of Rockwood, resisting arrest, assault on an officer, & theft. While at the scene, an unexpected turn occurred when two suspects drove-up in a Mustang and said they were at the wrong address. It turns out the car was recently stolen from a hotel in Athens. Charged with car theft was Ricky Self of Englewood and Jennifer Menchaca of Hamby Street, Athens.

◆ DANCE ATTENDANCE BREAKS RECORD

Attendance at this past weekend's Athens Daddy-Daughter Dances broke the previous record. The attendance for the four dances totaled 1,930. The previous attendance record was 1,847 set in 2012. Over the past 28 years, 28,193 people have attended the Daddy Daughter Dances.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ In Midland City, Alabama FBI agents entered the bunker where a five-year-old boy was being held hostage, to rescue him after fearing that he was in imminent danger. The boy was taken to safety without injury and was treated at a local hospital. The gunman, identified as 65 year old Jimmy Lee Dykes is dead. It was the seventh day of unsuccessful negotiations.

◆ The FBI is investigating the death of Sarai Sierra, a New York City woman, who was on a solo vacation in Istanbul. Turkish authorities invited the investigators to assist as they try to find out what happened to Sierra. She was the mother of two and disappeared on January 21. Twelve days later, her body was found near the remnants of the city's ancient walls.

◆ President Obama spoke at the police department special operations center yesterday in Minneapolis, Minn., urging Congress to pass gun control measures. He believes that real and lasting change requires Congress to do its part and do it soon. Minnesota is home to many gun-rights advocates and discussions have increased there since the mass shooting at Accent Signage Systems in Minneapolis, which resulted in six dead.

◆ **MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT:** The Dow Jones dropped back below 14,000 as the stock market closed out it's worst day so far this year. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 129.71 at 13,880.08. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 17.46 at 1,495.71, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 47.93 at 3,131.17. Volume on the New York Stock Exchange was 654.73 million shares traded. Decliners outnumbered advancers by roughly a 6 to 1 margin.

Today In History - February 5

1631 - British clergyman Roger Williams arrived in Salem, Massachusetts, seeking religious freedom. He founded the colony of Rhode Island.

1900 - American statesman Adlai E. Stevenson was born. He served as U.S. ambassador to the United Nations from 1961 to 1965. He was the Democratic nominee for President in 1952 and 1956, losing both times to Dwight Eisenhower.

1934 - Baseball home-run king Hank Aaron was born in Mobile, Alabama. He spent his entire major league career playing outfield for the Braves--first in Milwaukee and later in Atlanta. He broke Babe Ruth's lifetime record of 714 home runs when he hit his 715th homer on April 8, 1974, at Atlanta Stadium.

1937 - President Franklin D. Roosevelt proposed increasing the number of Supreme Court justices. Critics charged that he was attempting to "pack" the court.
