## Local and State News

### ◆ ATHENS HAS ANOTHER ARMED ROBBERY

Athens Police are investigating an armed robbery at the Capital Bank of Athens on Decatur Pike. A lone gunman entered the bank shortly around 4:30 p.m. on Monday and demanded cash. He left the bank on foot with an undisclosed amount of cash. Bank employees told police that the suspect entered the bank wearing dark clothing with a hood over his head and was believed to be a white male. A suspect was spotted a short while later walking into some woods off Lynman Street. It's believed that he may have fled in an older model green ford truck with an extended cab.

### ◆ U.T. PLANS TO HOLD "SEX WEEK"

The University of Tennessee in Knoxville is coming under lots of criticism from conservatives, Christians, and some state lawmakers over its first-ever "Sex Week." The event is planned for April, and features a lesbian bondage expert, a sex talent show, and a campus-wide scavenger hunt for a "golden condom." The event is reportedly being funded with \$20,000 in university money and student fees.

## NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Bosco Ntaganda, nicknamed "The Terminator," has turned himself in at the U.S. Embassy in Kigali, Rwanda. Ntaganda is known for his ruthless actions of using child soldiers during his time as a senior commander in a Congolese rebel group accused of terrorizing the Ituri region of eastern Congo between 2002 and 2003.

◆ Argentine President Cristina Fernandez met with Pope Francis at the Vatican on Monday and asked him to help defuse the long-running dispute between Argentina and Britain over the Falkland Islands. It is not known how he responded.

◆ As part of a new anti-smoking initiative, New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg is pushing for a new citywide law requiring stores to physically conceal cigarettes and other tobacco products behind counters, curtains or cabinets, out of public view.

◆ CNN is being harshly criticized for its coverage of the Steubenville, Ohio, rape verdict involving a pair of high-school football players, whose focus has been mainly on the rapists rather than the 16-year-old victim. One viewer, Gabriel Garcia, requested that CNN apologize on-air, several times over the course of the next week, at the start of every hour, for their so called shameful coverage. Maybe CNN was listening. On Monday, CNN aired a segment that focused on the struggle the victim faces as a survivor.

**William Franklin "Frank" Landreth, Sr.**, age 88, of Etowah died last Saturday. He had been an engineer for L and N Railroad. He served in the Army during World War II and was stationed at Pearl Harbor and was an eyewitness when it was bombed on December 7, 1941. He later volunteered to be a member of Merrill's Marauders in Burma. He walked 1,000 miles across Burma, fighting the Japanese along the way. He was one of the 300 survivors out of the 3,000 men who started with Merrill's Marauders. Later, he survived a head-on train collision. Funeral services will be at 7 p.m. Tuesday at Bordwine Funeral Home, with visitation from 5 to 7 p.m.

## THIS DAY IN HISTORY - MARCH 19

**1848** - Wyatt Earp was born in Illinois. He was an assistant marshal in Dodge City, Kansas. Later, he and his two brothers--along with Doc Holliday--forced a showdown with the Ike Clanton outlaw gang in the famous gunfight at the OK Corral in Tombstone, Arizona.

**1860** - William Jennings Bryan was born. He was a member of Congress, U.S. Secretary of State, and unsuccessful candidate for president. In 1925, he assisted the prosecution in the trial of John T. Scopes in Dayton, TN. Scopes was accused of teaching evolution in a public school. Bryan died in Dayton shortly after the trial ended. Bryan College in Dayton is named for him.

**1937** - Singer Clarence "Frogman" Henry was born. His hit records include "Ain't Got No Home" and "But I Do."
