Local and State News

◆ A BAD WEEKEND FOR MOTORCYCLISTS

Three men died in separate motorcycle crashes in East Tennessee this past weekend. An Alabama man, 60-year-old Leon Frank, was killed just before noon on Sunday when his motorcycle was hit head-on by an SUV as he was trying to pass another vehicle on Highway 68 in Monroe County. A Georgetown man, 29-year-old John Cox, was killed Sunday afternoon when his motorcycle collided with a pickup truck on Highway 58 in Hamilton County. And a Georgia man, Patrick Noll, died Saturday evening on "The Dragon" in Blount County when his rear wheel locked up, causing his bike to skid. Noll fell off, hit a tree, and rolled down the hill. "The Dragon" is notorious for its 318 sharp curves within 11 miles.

◆ ATHENS TRIMS BUSHES & TREES

The Athens Public Works Department has an on-going program of cutting back bushes and tree limbs that hang low over streets or obstruct the view at intersections. City ordinances make it unlawful for a property owner to allow any limbs on his property to project out over any street or sidewalk at a height of less than 14 feet. It is also unlawful for property owners to have any fence, tree, hedge or sign which prevents motorists from having a clear view of traffic at intersections. If you do not want Public Works crews cutting back trees or bushes on the right-of-way near your yard, you need to make sure to trim them yourself. You should also trim any growth that impedes streets, signs, or sidewalks. The growth should be cut back at least three feet.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The Washington Post Co. chairman Donald Graham announced that his family has agreed to sell its storied newspaper to Amazon.com founder Jeff Bezos for \$250 million. The Graham family bought the Post in 1933, which is the seventh largest newspaper in America. The newspaper's profits plummeted 83 percent during the first quarter of this year.

◆ U.S. diplomatic posts in the Mideast and Africa will remain closed for the rest of the week amid intercepted chatter about terror threats. One lawmaker said the chatter was specific as to certain dates and the scope of the operation. Others said it suggested that a major terrorist attack, similar to 9/11, was being planned by an al-Qaida terrorist group based in Yemen.

◆ Alice Gruppioni, 32, was honeymooning in California when she was killed by a driver who drove a sedan into a crowd on the Venice Beach boardwalk. Authorities arrested 38-year-old Nathan Louis Campbell after he walked into a nearby police station and said he was involved. Investigators say Campbell acted alone.

◆ Major League Baseball disciplined 13 players in a drug case, including Alex Rodriguez, who was suspended through 2014. All-Stars Nelson Cruz, Johnny Peralta and Everth Cabrera were banned 50 games apiece. This was the most sweeping punishment since the Black Sox scandal nearly a century ago.

1809 - British poet Alfred Lord Tennyson was born. His works include "The Charge of the Light Brigade" and "Ulysses."

1890 - The electric chair was used for the first time, to execute a convicted murderer at Auburn State Prison in New York.

1917 - Actor Robert Mitchum was born. He also had a hit record, "The Ballad of Thunder Road."

1926 - Gertrude Ederle of New York became the first American to swim the English Channel.

1945 - An American bomber dropped the first atomic bomb used in warfare on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. Eight days later, after Nagasaki was also bombed, Japan surrendered, ending World War II. About 140,000 people died in the two bombings and the aftermath.
