### State & Local News

#### ◆ SPOTLIGHT ON CRESCENT SOCK CO.

The slogan on the Crescent Sock Company's Website says it all: "We're crazy about socks!" Crescent, which is based in Niota, is one of the businesses featured in February's *Tennessee Business Spotlight* on the Tennessee Secretary of State's Website. The *Spotlight* quotes Cathy Allen, president of the 112-year-old family-owned business, as saying socks are not "one size fits all." She says people who are buying socks often consider the coloring and texture of the socks without ever bothering to look at the sizes on the packaging. She also says washing and drying socks inside-out reduces wear and tear.

In addition to the standard solid-color styles, Crescent sells socks in a variety of patterns, including dots, stripes, flowers, and animal prints. Crescent also gives away many pairs of its socks to people recovering from disasters or going on mission trips.

Crescent was started in 1902 when a group of businessmen led by James L. Burn met at the Niota Depot to discuss how to create jobs for their community. They decided to open a hosiery mill. Inspired by the name of the Cincinnati-to-New Orleans train route that ran through Niota, they named it Crescent.

### National & International News

◆ A warning has been issued by the Department of Homeland Security to U.S. and some foreign airlines traveling to Russia for the Olympic Games, to be on the lookout for toothpaste containers. Some intelligence indicates they may actually hold ingredients that could be used to construct a bomb aboard a plane. The Department of Homeland Security regularly shares relevant information with domestic and international partners, including those associated with international events such as the Sochi Olympics.

◆ Clay Aiken, a former "American Idol", says he will run for the U.S. Congress as a Democrat in his home state of North Carolina, where he once worked as a special education teacher. Aiken tried to position himself as a political outsider who wants to change Washington by giving a voice to people in need.

◆ In the Northeastern United States, almost a million homes and businesses were without power on yesterday following severe snow and ice storms overnight. Pennsylvania was the hardest hit state with over 720,000 customers out of power. Maryland, Arkansas, New Jersey, West Virginia, Kentucky, Delaware, New York and Ohio were the other states that were affected the worst.

### CITY ISSUES ADVISORY ON POLITICAL SIGNS

With elections looming, we're beginning to see political signs sprouting up across Athens. The Community Development Department reminds you that no political sign shall be placed within any public right of way; temporary signs shall not be erected or fastened to a pole, tree, or fence within the right-of-way of any street; no sign may be placed on any public or private property without permission, and no banner or sign may be placed across any public street or alley without permission from the city. As a general rule of thumb, signs should be located at least two (2) feet behind any utility pole, and signs can never be attached directly to a utility pole.
