NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ The "Nutrition Facts" for food labels on nearly every food package in grocery stores are getting a new look. The new proposal for food labels will put emphasis on calories and sugar. The calories would be in larger, bolder print, and consumers would know whether foods have added sugars. The FDA will take comments on the proposal for 90 days. A final rule on the new labels could take a year, and once the new labels have been finalized, industries will have two years to comply.
- ◆ Arizona Governor Jan Brewer vetoed a controversial bill that would have allowed people with sincerely held religious beliefs to refuse to serve gays. Governor Brewer said she could not sign a bill that was not only unneeded but would damage the state's improving business environment and divide its citizens. Brewer claims the bill is broadly worded and could result in unintended and negative consequences. Opponents of the bill view it as a veiled attempt to legally discriminate against gay people, and proponents of the bill believe that protection from lawsuits is needed to people who assert their religious beliefs in refusing service to gays or others who offend their beliefs.
- ◆ After experiencing faintness and shortness of breath at work, Attorney General Eric Holder was hospitalized for several hours on Thursday. Holder was taken to a Washington hospital and was discharged later in the day and sent home to rest.
