◆ FIERY WRECKS SHUT DOWN I-75

Two separate traffic crashes on I-75 Sunday afternoon shut down northbound traffic in southern McMinn County for two hours. ◆ FATAL RAFTING ACCIDENT ON THE OCOEE

Gary Brown, 50, of North Carolina died last Saturday when the raft he was riding in overturned while going through the "Table Saw" rapid on the Ocoee River. His body was recovered further downstream. He drowned even though he was wearing a lifejacket.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ International diplomats meeting in Paris have pledged to fight the Islamic State group by any means necessary. John Kerry, U.S. Secretary of State, ruled out military cooperation with Iran but said Washington remained open to talks with Tehran about the threat posed by Islamic State militants.

◆ Shops in Mexico's Los Cabos beach were ransacked by looters after Hurricane Odile destroyed homes, flooded streets and wrecked hotels packed with tourists.

◆ General Motors will pay compensation for 19 deaths linked to a faulty ignition switch, more than the 13 deaths the automaker had previously admitted were caused by the now recalled part.

◆ The Tennessee Supreme Court has selected Herbert Slatery III to serve as the state's next attorney general. Slatery is from Knoxville, is a Republican, and currently serves as Governor Haslam's legal counsel.
