Local and State News

◆ USS CHARLES R. WARE TO HOLD REUNION

Former officers and crew members of the Navy destroyer, USS Charles R. Ware, will hold their annual reunion here in Athens this week. The festivities officially kick off Wednesday evening at the VFW Post. There will be a private dinner on Thursday at the McMinn Living Heritage Museum. On Friday, the Waremens will sponsor a show featuring comedian Bil Lepp at the Athens City Middle School auditorium open to McMinn County veterans and their families. On Saturday, the public is invited to join the officers and crew members for a ceremony in Veterans Memorial Park at 10 a.m. led by Congressman Chuck Fleischmann. The destroyer was named for Knoxville native Charles R. Ware, who joined the Navy from Athens in 1929. The ship was built in 1945 and saw action during the Vietnam War.



NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ President Obama says some foreign countries are not doing enough to confront the Ebola crisis in West Africa. He states that the international community has not been as aggressive as it needs to be to help contain what he's calling a top national security issue for the United States.

◆ On Monday, the U.S. Supreme Court declined to decide once and for all whether states can ban gay marriage. This will allow gay men and women to get married in five additional states, with more likely to follow. The high court without comment rejected appeals in cases involving five states, Virginia, Oklahoma, Utah, Wisconsin and Indiana that had prohibited gay marriage, leaving intact lower-court rulings striking down those bans.

◆ After treating two patients who died from Ebola, a Spanish nurse has contracted the disease at a Madrid hospital. This is the first known case of transmission outside of Africa.

◆ At least 30 people were killed in two suicide attacks on two checkpoints run by Kurdish fighters in Syria's northeastern city of Hasakah. The attacks targeted checkpoints run by Kurdish fighters on the western entrance of the city.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 17.72 at 16,991.97. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 3.08 at 1,964.82. The NASDAQ Composite Index was down 20.82 at 4,454.80.

- 1849** - Author Edgar Allan Poe died at age 40.
