Local & State News

◆ SEN. ALEXANDER TO VISIT WATTS BAR

U.S. Senator Lamar Alexander will visit the Watts Bar Nuclear Plant this morning. He'll be briefed by TVA officials on the significant accomplishments and milestones being achieved at the Unit 2 nuclear reactor as the unit nears completion and will soon be ready for licensing by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. TVA President and CEO Bill Johnson will accompany Senator Alexander on the visit. When it is finished, the Unit 2 reactor will be the first new commercial reactor to begin operation in the U.S. in the 21st Century. It will provide enough power to serve 650,000 homes.

- ✓ The McMinn County Board of Education holds its monthly meeting tomorrow, Oct. 9th, at 5:30 p.m. at the Center for Educational Excellence, #3 South Hill Street, Athens.
- ✓ The McMinn County Election Commission machine technicians and Harp Enterprise will be inspecting and setting voting machines for the Nov. 4th elections this Friday, Oct. 10th, at 9 a.m. at the McMinn County Courthouse Annex. That includes both early voting machines and election day machines.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ An earthquake with a magnitude of 6.4 has struck in China's southwestern province of Yunnan. The United States Geological Survey said the quake's epicenter was 10 km deep underground. Shaking could be felt in the provincial capital of Yunnan, as well as several other major cities in the province.
- ◆ In Midland, Texas, a 41-year-old man got a surprise when he tried to impersonate a police officer and berate a driver he says "cut him off." It was a police detective that the driver chastised. The man was jailed on \$25,000 bond and could face up to 10 years in prison if convicted of the third-degree felony charge of impersonating or exerting the functions of a public servant.
- ◆ Four men in their early 20's have been arrested by British anti-terrorism police in London as part of an investigation into Islamist-related militancy. The arrests and searches are part of an ongoing investigation into Islamist related terrorism, and a number of residential addresses and vehicles are being searched by special officers in west and central London.
- ◆ Due to ballooning healthcare costs, Wal-Mart Stores Inc will no longer provide health benefits to part-time workers in the United States who work less than 30 hours per week. Wal-Mart follows Target and Home Depot which have already announced healthcare cuts, primarily due to Obamacare.

1871 - The Great Chicago Fire started. It destroyed more than 17,000 buildings and killed more than 250 people. Many people believe the fire started when a cow owned by a Mrs. O'Leary kicked over a lighted lantern in a barn.

1890 - World War One flying ace Eddie Rickenbacker was born. He shot down 22 enemy planes. He later became president of Eastern Airlines.

1918 - Sergeant Alvin York of Tennessee became a World War One hero by capturing a hill in the Argonne Forest of France, killing 25 enemy soldiers and capturing 132 others single-handedly.
