- ✓ This week is Fall Break for the public schools in McMinn and Meigs Counties, including the Athens and Etowah City schools. Christ's Legacy Academy also has the week off.
- ✓ The McMinn County Circuit Court Clerk's office will be closed Wednesday through Saturday this week so they can move to their new location at the Judicial Complex at the Justice Center. The office will reopen on October 20th. The phone number will remain the same, 745-1923.
- ✓ Beginning this Wednesday, October 15th, anyone wanting to do outdoor burning must get a burn permit from the Tennessee Division of Forestry. The no-burn season continues through May 15th.
- ✓ The annual "Jimmy Limer Memorial Christmas Parade" in Athens will be held on Monday, December 1st, at 7 p.m. The parade theme this year will be **Christmas on Parade**. Any organization, church, business or industry interested in having a float in the parade needs to submit an application form by November 21st. Forms are available at the Athens Area Chamber of Commerce office, 13 North Jackson Street.
