### Local & State News

#### ◆ TORTURED KITTEN DIES

An 8-week-old kitten that was tortured and burned in Cleveland earlier this month has died. Dr. Todd Dolen had been taking care of the kitten named "Katniss" at the Animal Aid Clinic in Athens. He says Katniss fought a brave fight for two weeks, but died this past Sunday. Cleveland police say the kitten suffered 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree burns over 90% of its body. They believe a group of young boys set the kitten on fire. Police are offering a \$1,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of those responsible.

#### ◆ ATHENS POLICE/FIRE REPORT FOR SEPT.

At their monthly meeting Tuesday night, the Athens City Council received the monthly police and fire reports for September. Police Chief Chuck Ziegler's report said there were 56 thefts in Athens, 23 assaults, 11 burglaries, 3 robberies, 2 motor vehicle thefts, and 1 sex offense. Police issued 466 citations for moving violations. The total number of tickets written so far this year is 4787, down sharply from 6198 for the same period last year.

Athens Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 46 calls in September. Thirteen were vehicle accidents, 13 were false alarms, two were vehicle fires, and one was a residential fire.

### NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The Homeland Security Department said everyone coming to the United States from the three West African countries at the center of the Ebola outbreak will now be screened for the deadly disease. Everyone traveling to the U.S. will have to arrive at New York's Kennedy, Newark Liberty, Washington's Dulles, Chicago's O'Hare or Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson airport for screening.

◆ American detainee Jeffrey Fowle has been released from North Korea, nearly six months after he was taken into custody on charges of leaving a Bible in a nightclub. Two other Americans convicted of crimes in North Korea are still being held.

◆ Three American teenage girls from the Denver area have been tracked down by the FBI in Germany while en route to Syria to join militant groups. The girls were trying "to fulfill what they believe is some vision that has been put out on a slick media campaign" by radical groups in Syria, including ISIS.
