◆ RESOLUTE ANNOUNCES BIG EXPANSION

Resolute Forest Products U.S. announces it will invest \$270 million to build a major expansion at its pulp and paper mill in Calhoun. The expansion will create 105 new jobs. Resolute says it has decided to enter the toilet paper and paper towel market. The company will build a new state-of-the-art facility at the Calhoun plant to manufacture tissue for use in the at-home, premium private label tissue market, including bath tissue and paper towels. Construction on the tissue project will begin this month, with production expected to start in the first quarter of 2017. The Resolute plant at Calhoun began operations as Bowater in 1954 and currently employs a work force of more than 500 people.



NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Homicides in the city of Baltimore were at an all-time high during the month of May. There were 43 reported homicides during May 2015, the most reported in more than 40 years.

◆ An American tourist travelling at a park near Johannesburg, South Africa was killed after a lion jumped at the woman through an open window of her car. A tour operator was injured in the attack. The lion will not be euthanized, but could be moved to a private location.

◆ Secretary of State John Kerry is scheduled to return to Boston where he will have surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital. Kerry has a broken femur which he suffered during a biking accident in Europe on Sunday.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks finished slightly higher as investors eyed economic data and watched for progress in Greek debt talks. Reports showed that consumer spending was unexpectedly flat in April, while manufacturing expanded more than forecasted in May as orders grew at the fastest pace in five months. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 29.69 at 18,040.37. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 4.34 at 2,111.73. and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 12.90 at 5,082.93.

VANDALS STRIKE DECATUR CEMETERY

Vandals struck the Decatur Cemetery this past weekend. Nearly 20 headstones were knocked over and broken. Some of the headstones were over 100 years old. The same thing happened at the cemetery about five years ago. Four juveniles have been arrested and have confessed to the crime. They are being charged with vandalism and curfew violations.

- 1851** - Maine became the first state to enact a law prohibiting alcohol.
- 1897** - Mark Twain was quoted by the New York Journal as saying "the report of my death was an exaggeration."
- 1924** - Congress granted U.S. citizenship to all American Indians. They pay state and federal taxes, but if they live on a reservation they do not pay taxes on property and reservation lands.
- 1937** - Actress Sally Kellerman was born.
- 1932** - Singer Sammy Turner was born. He had a big hit record in 1959, "Lavender Blue."
- 1944** - Composer and piano player Marvin Hamlisch was born. His biggest hit record was "The Entertainer."
