State and Local News

◆ AUB RATES TO HOLD NEARLY STEADY IN JULY

Electric power rates from AUB will be relatively flat moving into July. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says TVA's summer base rate remains static while the fuel charge for July has moved up just a hair. Scarbrough says the higher fuel charge will mean an increase of about \$1.29 in the average AUB customer's monthly bill.

◆ 10TH DISTRICT DRUG SEIZURES 2ND HIGHEST

The Tennessee Comptroller's office has released its annual review of funds administered by Tennessee's Drug Task Forces in the state's 31 judicial districts. The report says auditors had just three findings this year. Those were in the 1st, 3rd, and 8th Judicial Districts. The report shows that the 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force had the second highest amount of revenue from forfeitures and seizures, over \$1 million. The 10th District consists of McMinn, Bradley, Monroe and Polk counties. That was second only to the 21st Judicial District, which reported over \$2 million in seizures. The 21st District covers Hickman, Lewis, Perry, and Williamson counties.

◆ The Federal Communications Commission voted on a proposal to make major phone companies offer services to customers that would block unwanted robocalls and spam texts. This is a big step for Americans who put their numbers on the Federal Trade Commission's Do-Not-Call registry and still get unwanted calls. Consumers can expect to see robocall-blocking technology provided from the phone companies for wireless and landlines, as well as opportunities for consumers to consent to receive or block robocalls.

TODAY IN HISTORY - June 19

- 1902** - Bandleader Guy Lombardo was born in Canada. His band's New Year's Eve broadcasts became an American national tradition. He called his music "the sweetest music this side of Heaven."
- 1903** - Baseball player Lou Gehrig was born. He was a star first baseman and hitter for the New York Yankees. He played in 2,130 consecutive games. He died at the age of 37 from a rare and fatal form of paralysis, which has since come to be called "Lou Gehrig's Disease."
- 1914** - Bluegrass pioneer Lester Flatt was born. Along with banjo picker Earl Scruggs, he had scores of hit records, including "Foggy Mountain Breakdown," "Cabin In the Hills," and "The Ballad of Jed Clampett."
- 1934** - Congress created the Federal Communications Commission to regulate interstate communications, including radio and television broadcasting. Among other things, the FCC assigns frequencies and issues licenses.
