State and Local News

◆ STARR EMERGENCY CHIEF KILLED IN PLANE CRASH

The Medical Director of the Emergency Room at Starr Regional Medical Center in Athens, Dr. Rick Kalister, has been killed in a plane crash. Dr. Kalister, his wife, and their daughter were killed Sunday evening when their Beechcraft plane crashed into a house in Plainville, Massachusetts. They were traveling to Boston with their daughter on a college visit. The crash caused a huge fire which virtually destroyed the house. The wreckage of the plane wound up on a hillside in the yard behind the house. Police in Plainville say the four occupants of the house escaped unharmed. Neighbors say they heard the plane's engine sputtering and then heard a crash and saw smoke. The Kalister family lived in Knoxville. Dr. Kalister worked for TeamHealth, a company which provides emergency room staffing to hospitals. He had been assigned to Starr Regional since 2001. (Photo by Mac Takach)



NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ President Obama signed two trade bills into law Monday that will give him "fast track authority" to secure a Pacific trade deal as well as provides assistance to workers. President Obama believes the trade agreements that come under this authorization will improve the system of trade that we have right now.

◆ Greece shut down its banks Monday on the brink of a major default on its loans before Tuesday's deadline, and created financial chaos among its citizens. Greeks are limited to 60 euros a day in cash withdrawals, worth about \$60, as the value of the euro against the dollar has plummeted.

◆ The Islamic State has executed more than 3,000 people in the last year. According to the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, more than 1,700 civilians including 74 children were executed since the terrorist group officially declared the establishment of a caliphate on June 29, 2014.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks were sharply lower after uneasiness heightened over the weekend that Greece could exit the euro area. Greek voters will participate in a July 5th referendum to vote on austerity measures being imposed by their European creditors. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 350.33 at 17,596.35. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 43.85 at 2,057.64, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 122.04 at 4,958.47.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 30

1859 - French acrobat Blondin crossed Niagara Falls on a tightrope as 5,000 spectators watched.

1917 - Singer Lena Horne was born. Her biggest hit record was "Stormy Weather." Lena Horne died May 9, 2010.

1921 - Documents were signed forming the Radio Corporation of America, better known as RCA. RCA soon rivaled its main competitor, General Electric (GE).

1934 - Adolf Hitler began his "blood purge" of political and military leaders in Germany in what came to be known as "The Night of the Long Knives."

1936 - The Pulitzer Prize-winning novel "Gone With The Wind" was published. The book by Margaret Mitchell was made into the longest film of its day—220 minutes. The story is set in Atlanta in the Civil War days and has remained popular throughout the years. The movie starred Clark Gable as Rhett Butler, Vivian Leigh, and Olivia de Havilland, among others, including Butterfly McQueen.

1953 - The first Corvette rolled off the Chevrolet assembly line in Flint, MI. That early 'Vette sold for \$3,250.
