• A top ISIS leader in charge of the terror group's foreign fighter operations and who was responsible for moving people and supplies into Syria and Iraq has been killed by a U.S. drone strike.

• Travelers on board a United Express flight from St. Louis, Missouri to Washington D.C.,got a midair scare Thursday on one of the busiest travel days of the year when an unruly passenger's bomb threat forced the plane to make an emergency landing.

• According to a new study published in the American Journal of *Medical Genetics*, people with lighter eye colors appear to be more likely to develop alcoholism. 
