State and Local News

◆ WEEKEND TRAFFIC DELAYS ON I-24

A section of Interstate 24 will be closed to traffic for several hours this Saturday night, July 18. It's part of the project to replace a bridge over I-24 near mile marker 165 in Marion County. The contractor will be demolishing the old bridge from 10 p.m. Saturday until 6 a.m. Sunday. Workers will take the structure apart in pieces and drop them onto the interstate below. The interstate road surface will be protected with mats during the work. The interstate will be closed in both directions with a 10-mile detour for eastbound traffic and a 17-mile detour for westbound traffic.

◆ TORNADO CONFIRMED IN MADISONVILLE

The National Weather Service has confirmed that an EF-1 tornado touched down in the vicinity of Gamble Gap and Old State Roads in Madisonville Tuesday night. They also looked at damage in Sweetwater, but concluded the damage there was more consistent with straight-line winds. In Meigs County, a barn at the Jim Hagler Farm near the junction of Highways 68 and 58 was destroyed by fire Tuesday night when it was apparently hit by lightning. The fire destroyed a tractor, bush hogs, two harvesters, and about 3,000 bales of hay.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Four U.S. Marines were killed and a Chattanooga police officer and a sailor werewounded in a terrorist shooting incident Thursday in Chattanooga. The shooter died in the incident near the Naval-Marine Reserve Center on Amnicola Highway, and was identified as 24-year-old Muhammad Youssef Abdulazeez of Hixson. Witnesses say the shooter fired multiple shots from his car into the front doors and windows of the recruiting center on Lee Highway and then drove to the Navy Reserve Center 6 miles away and fired again, killing four Marines. With word of an active shooter situation, Chattanooga and surrounding counties went on high alert. Erlanger and Memorial hospitals, Chattanooga State and Lee Uni-

versities went on lockdown. The VA Clinic in Athens was locked downed, and McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy assigned extra officers to the Courthouse and the National Guard Armory. Abdulazeez was a native of Kuwait and was a naturalized U.S. citizen. He graduated from UTC in 2012 with a degree in Electrical Engineering and did an internship with TVA. The New York Times reported his father had been on a terriorist watch list.
