◆ The family of the man who shot and killed four Marines and a Navy sailor in Chattanooga last Thursday has issued a statement saying their son, Muhammad Youssef Abdulazeez, had suffered from depression for many years. The statement says: "It grieves us beyond belief to know that his pain found its expression in this heinous act of violence." Meanwhile, governors in several states have ordered National Guardsmen to be armed. Gov. Bill Haslam has directed the Tennessee Adjutant General to review security policies at National Guard armories and recruiting facilities and to take steps to ensure the safety of Guardsmen, citizens, and property. Congressman Scott DesJarlais of Tennessee plans to introduce legislation Monday that would repeal bans on military personnel carrying firearms on bases and at military recruitment facilities.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY - JULY 20

- 1859** - American baseball fans had to pay an admission fee for the first time. Fifteen-thousand people paid 50¢ to see Brooklyn play New York.
- 1919** - Sir Edmund Hillary, the New Zealand explorer, was born. He became the first man to conquer Mount Everest.
- 1942** - Country singer T.G. Sheppard was born in Alamo, Tennessee. His real name was William Neal Browder. His hit records include "Finally" and "Smooth Sailing".
- 1944** - A time bomb planted by German generals exploded in Nazi leader Adolf Hitler's headquarters. Hitler escaped, and had nearly 5,000 people executed in revenge.
- 1969** - Two American astronauts landed the lunar module "Eagle" on the moon. Neil Armstrong became the first man to set foot on the moon's surface. His first words were, "That's one small step for a man...one giant leap for mankind."
