◆ INDUSTRY WEEK AWARDS PRESENTED

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ The gunman who opened fire at the Umpqua Community College in Oregon Thursday died by suicide. Ten people, including the gunman, died in the shooting spree. According to witnesses, the gunman asked each student what their religion was and if they said "Christian" he shot them dead.
- ◆ The Charleston, SC office of the National Weather Service said that the city received 11.5 inches of rain on Saturday, making it the wettest day on record for Charleston. Hundreds of people had to be rescued by watercraft after the city was completely flooded.
- ◆ The Coast Guard says it is continuing to search for a cargo ship with 33 people on board that has gone missing near the Bahamas after it was caught in Hurricane Joaquin.
- ◆ A U.S. airstrike at a building thought to be hiding Afgan Taliban terrorists turned out to be a Doctors Without Borders hospital. The airstrike killed 19 staff and patients and wounded another 37. Doctors Without Borders said it will close its facility in Afghanistan.

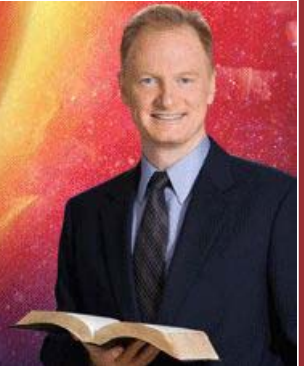
