◆ VETERANS PARADE DEPENDS ON WEATHER

The weather forecast is calling for a significant chance of rain Saturday afternoon in Athens, and that is threatening the Veterans Parade. The parade is scheduled for 3 p.m. in Downtown Athens. However, American Legion Commander Dick Pelley says it will be cancelled in the event of rain. Pelley says a decision will be made at 9 a.m. Saturday. That decision will be announced on WYXI Radio (AM-1390).

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Luke Schemm, 17, a high school football player from western Kansas, who collapsed on the sidelines during a playoff game has died. This is the 11th confirmed U.S. high school football fatality since July.

◆ Bernie Sanders, the Independent senator from Vermont and Democratic presidential candidate, introduced a bill in the Senate on Wednesday that would rescind all federal penalties for growing or possessing marijuana. This would allow states to determine their own laws. If successful, the bill would remove all references to cannabis in the Controlled Substances Act.

◆ With less than a year until Election Day 2016, Hillary Clinton has established herself as the clear frontrunner in the race for the Democratic nomination. The Republican side is still very much up for grabs.

THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks were little changed as investors continue to process corporate earnings reports. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 4.15 at 17,863.43. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 2.38 at 2,099.93, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 14.74 at 5,127.74.
