Local & State News

◆ VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR MAIN STREET

The Athens Main Street committee members are accepting resumés and/or letters of interest from individuals interested in serving on either a committee or the board of directors. ◆ PUBLIC INPUT NEEDED ON BROADBAND

The Tennessee state government is encouraging the public to take part in a statewide broadband survey. Response is needed from all sectors--education, healthcare, businesses, and residences. Response is needed from all types of devices--mobile, tablets, etc. If you do not have internet access at home, you can complete the survey at the library or any other public access location. NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ President Obama proposed a \$4.1 trillion spending plan for fiscal year 2017 in a final White House budget that met immediate Republican resistance for its cost and reliance on tax hikes to fund domestic priorities.

◆ Two commuter trains crashed head-on Tuesday in southern Germany. Ten people were killed and at least 80 people were injured. The trains slammed into each other on a curve after an automatic safety braking system apparently failed.

◆ Baltimore prosecutors have asked a judge to delay the trials of three police officers charged in the Freddie Gray case. The delay is dependant upon the appellate courts deciding if another officer awaiting retrial on related charges can be compelled to testify against them.

◆ According to a new study published in the Journal of the American Medical Association Ophthalmology, the Zika virus may be associated with another birth defect in infants. Researchers from Brazil found that some infants exposed to the virus have ocular defects including atrophied retinas, abnormal iris pigmentation and lens that moved out of place.
