◆ McMINN CO. MAN ELECTED AS TRUMP DELEGATE A McMinn County man is one of the delegates from Tennessee to the 2016 Republican National Convention this summer in Cleveland, Ohio. David Riden was elected as one of 33 delegates for Donald Trump. The State Executive Committee of the Tennessee Republican Party has approved the final slate of delegates to the convention. There are 33 Trump delegates, 16 Ted Cruz delegates, and 9 delegates for Marco Rubio. Under Tennessee law, delegates are bound to their respective candidates for two rounds of balloting at the convention. However, Riden says Trump has requested that his delegates stay with him throughout the balloting.

◆ Five people were killed in the crash of a sightseeing helicopter Monday afternoon in Pigeon Forge, about three miles from Dollywood. The Bell 206 copter was operated by Smoky Mountain Helicopeters, which has been offering helicopter sightseeing tours since 1976.

◆ Voters in Wisconsin go to the polls today. The state is considered a key step in the race for president and may play a big role on whether Donald Trump will win the Republican nomination.

♦ HEALTH DEPT. ISSUES RAW MILK WARNING The Tennessee Department of Health has issued a warning about drinking raw milk. In a news release, the Health Department says milk, whether it comes from seemingly healthy cows or goats, can cause serious health problems including death if it has not been pasteurized to kill harmful bacteria. The warning follows an announcement by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention regarding hospitalizations and a death from Listeria infections linked to people drinking raw milk from a Pennsylvania dairy. In the past three years, Tennessee has experienced several outbreaks associated with drinking raw milk. Notably, in 2013, nine residents under the age of nine were sickened with Ecoli bacteria. Five of them required hospitalization for life-threatening kidney failure. Health officials say the most common causes of milk contamination is getting animal feces directly in the milk. Pasteurization kills those bad bacteria.
