Local and Area News AUB TO HAVE "FINAL PUSH" TOMORROW

Since mid-March, power crews from Athens Utilities Board have worked on a project to upgrade the power lines, poles and various electrical hardware on South Jackson Street. They plan to finalize the project on Tuesday and as a result, South Jackson Street will be closed to through traffic between Green Street and Highway 39 from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. AUB crews will remove all of the old power pole tops, cross arms, and AUB attachments as well as removal of all of the old power lines. AUB spokesman Wayne Scarbrough says that the work can be dangerous and asks all motorists to be aware of the need to restrict traffice and vehicle speeds on Tuesday. This should be the last time that traffic will be disrupted on South Jackson St.

• WELL KNOWN PHARMACIST PASSES AWAY Dr. Jack K. Wallace, the owner of the former Riddle and Wallace Drug Store of Athens, died Sunday morning at his residence. He was 93. A preliminary obituary is on page 2.

STATE, NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The owner of Companion Funeral Home of Cleveland has been fined \$1,000 by the Tennessee Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers. Trae Cody forged the Medical Examiner's name on a death certificate in order to "speed up" delivery to a grieving family. It's the first time that Companion has been cited by the state.

◆ Governor Haslam has signed into law a bill that gives fantasy sports gaming companies an exemption from Tennessee's anti-gambling laws. Nearly one million residents of Tennessee already play fantasy sports and will be able to do so legally.

◆ The THP closed a portion of I-24 in Marion County on Friday in order to re-enact a fatal wreck that involved State Trooper Clyde Reeves. Reeves was driving a THP SUV when he struck a motorcyclist on the Nickajack Bridge, killing 66 year-old Jim Garner.

An earthquake measuring 2.5 in magnitude struck an area 29 miles east of Athens about 5:15 p.m. on Saturday.

♦ A mother and her daughter from Charlotte, NC have been rescued by a helicopter pilot in New Zealand. Carolyn Lloyd, 45, and her daughter Rachel Lloyd, 22, were lost in a large forest.

◆ A teenage girl was killed Friday night when she was ejected from a spinning carnival ride at an El Paso, Texas, church.

◆ ACSX train derailed in Washington, DC Sunday morning causing officials to close the District's Metro Rail System for a time.

◆ A social media app popular with young people is at the center of a lawsuit in Atlanta. Christal McGee, age 18, recorded herself driving over 100 mph using Snapchat. She crashed into another driver causing him permanent brain damage.
