♦ TWO DIE IN McMINN COUNTY CRASHES

There were two fatal traffic crashes in McMinn County over this past weekend. The first happened last Friday evening on Highway 163, the Bowater Road, near Calhoun. State Trooper Travis Ryans says 57-year-old David P. Harris of Tellico Plains was traveling east on Highway 163 when for unknown reasons, his pickup truck ran off the right side of the road, went airborne, and struck a large tree. Harris was crushed between the steering column and the seat. He managed to climb out of the truck, but died from his injuries outside the truck. The wreckage was not discovered until Saturday. Trooper Ryans says seat belts might have made a difference.

The second fatal accident happened Sunday afternoon on South Congress Parkway at Dennis Street in Athens. Police say a car driven by Tabatha Jewell made a left turn into the path of a motorcycle operated by 59-year-old Richard Cole of Riceville. Cole was killed. Ms. Jewell was treated at Starr Regional Medical Center for soreness. She has been charged with failure to provide proof of insurance. The investigation is continuing.

Vehicle Knocks Out Power

Power was knocked out for several hours Monday morning after a vehicle broke two power poles near the entrance to Madison Place Subdivision on Highway 39 between Athens and Riceville. AUB crews were able to get most customers back on fairly quickly, except for about 150 customers in areas behind Madison Place and down Highway 39 to Hammond's car lot. Their power was out for several hours. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says a lot of underground mainte-

nance was necessary where the underground power lines were damaged by the accident. Scarbrough says the vehicle that hit the poles left the road, struck one pole, hit a driveway culvert, went airborne, came down, and smacked the second pole. The vehicle then left the scene.
