State & Local News

♦ POWER RATES TO FALL IN FEBRUARY

The price for a kilowatt hour of power from AUB will edge down in February compared to the current January level. This is a result of a slightly lower fuel charge from TVA. The typical residential customer will find their utility bill about \$1.30 lower. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says some simple home projects can help you save even more on your power bill. He suggests installing weather stripping around doors and windows, adding insulation to attics, and wrapping water heaters and hot water pipes.

◆ POLICE & FIRE REPORTS FOR 2016

The Athens Police Department reports there were two homicides in the city in 2016. One of those remains unsolved. There were 753 thefts in 2016, 207 assaults, 186 burglaries, 76 vehicle thefts, 18 robberies, and 12 sex offenses. Every one of those categories was down compared to the year 2015 except for thefts and vehicle thefts. Athens police wrote 5,725 citations for moving violations in 2016, up sharply from 4,639 citations in 2015. There were 876 vehicle accidents in 2016, down from 901 in 2015. There were four fatalities and 146 injuries as a result of traffic accidents last year.

The Athens Fire Department responded to 624 calls in 2016, down from 627 in 2015. Losses for 2016 totaled \$715,950.

National - World News

- ◆ NASA astronaut Gene Ceman has died at age 82. He was the last man to walk on the moon, and was commander of the Apollo 17 mission, the final lunar landing in December 1972.
- ◆ Boeing CEO and chairman Dennis Muilenburg met with President-elect Donald Trump at Trump Tower in New York on Tuesday. Muilenburg said they discussed ways to simplify requirements for Air Force One "to make a better plane at a lower cost".
- ◆ General Motors is investing another \$1 billion in U.S. manufacturing operations. The investment covers "multiple new vehicle, advanced technology and component projects" which include 1,500 new and retained jobs.

♦ NEW SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER NAMED

The McMinn County Commission has approved Rob Shamblin to be the new county school board member for District 5. Shamblin replaces Larry Cantrell who resigned from the board recently and will fill the seat until the term expires in 2018.

The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 6.75 at 2,267.89, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 35.39 at 5,538.73. **Commodity Markets**: the spot price of gold rose \$13.09 to \$1,215.94. The spot price of silver rose \$0.36 to \$17.18, and crude oil prices rose \$0.11 to \$52.48.

Volume on the New York Stock Exchange was moderate, with 900.65 million shares traded. Decliners outnumbered advancers by roughly a 3-to-2 margin.
