#### **♦** A PEEK AT DOWNTOWN ATHENS HISTORY

Work is progressing at the old Antique Mall building across from the McMinn County Courthouse in Downtown Athens. Workmen are in the process of removing the front exterior of the building. They uncovered the windows with the Hiwassee Builders Supply sign still on them. Charlie Clark, the owner of Hiwassee Builders, says his father opened the store in Downtown Athens around 1960, and it was located there until 1972. He recalls that Cherokee Hardware was on the corner. The next office was Ott Shell's Ivan Allen Office Supply store. Hiwassee Builders was next to that, and the A&P grocery store was to the right of Hiwassee Builders. Charlotte Hyde sent us this photo of some history being uncovered in Downtown Athens.

• During his final news conference, President Obama defended commuting the prison sentence of Chelsea Manning. Obama stated that he felt very comfortable that justice had been served and a message had been sent when it comes to our national security.

• Governor Haslam is calling for a 7-cent increase in the state gasoline tax and a 12-cent increase on diesel fuel. The revenue will be used for transportation projects in all 95 of Tennessee's counties. At the same time, the governor is proposing a 0.5% cut in the sales tax on food and a 1.5% cut in the Hall Income Tax on interest and dividends this year with another 1.5% cut next year.

◆ State Rep. Sheila Butt has withdrawn her bill seeking to restrict which items Tennessee's food stamp recipients would be able to buy at the grocery store. She says the Trump administration is considering similar changes.

**1736** - Scottish inventor James Watt was born. He designed the engine that made steam power practical. **1807** - Robert E. Lee was born in 1807 in Virginia. He was the commander of the Confederate Army in the Civil War. Reportedly, he never smoked, drank alcohol, or used obscene language. He spent his final years after the war as president of Washington College in Lexington, Virginia. It was named Washington and Lee University after his death. **1809** - Edgar Allen Poe, poet and author, was born. His poem "The Raven" is one of the best-known poems in American literature.

**1939** - Singer Phil Everly of the Everly Brothers was born. The brothers' hit records included "Bird Dog," "Wake Up Little Susie," and "Crying In The Rain."
