National - World News

◆ Andrew Puzder withdrew his name from consideration for Labor Secretary Wednesday afternoon amid mounting controversy over his high-profile divorce and his business background in the fast-food industry.

◆ The Republican-led Senate has voted to abolish an Obama administration regulation that prevented people with mental disorders from being able to purchase a firearm. Critics say the rule was too broad and unfairly stigmatized the disabled.

◆ An American Eagle Airlines plane hit a deer while departing Charlotte-Douglas International Airport in North Carolina Wednesday afternoon. No one was injured, and the plane returned to the airport safely.

◆ In the first real blow to Obamacare, the IRS says it will follow President Trump's directive to ease up on the Affordable Care Act's requirement that everyone have health care or pay a penalty. Since Obamacare went into effect, tax filers were required to indicate on line 61 of their 1040 forms whether they have health coverage. Those who said they did not have health insurance faced a financial penalty. The IRS had planned to start rejecting returns this year on which the line was left blank. Now, though, the IRS says it will process such returns. The new policy leaves Obamacare's insurance requirement on the books, but it will be hard to enforce if taxpayers no longer have to disclose whether or not they have health coverage.
