♦ FAIRVIEW BAPTIST IS COMING HOME

The members of Fairview Baptist Church are excitedly looking forward to Sunday, May 21st. That's the day they will be returning to their church building on Fairview Road. The Fairview church and school campus was badly damaged by the tornado last November 30th. Since then, the church services have been held at the former American Bedding building on Dennis Street, and Fairview Christian Academy has been holding classes at the Four Star Academy building on Matlock Road. FCA will begin the next school year at the Four Star building. Church services will be held at 11 a.m. on May 21st in the repaired auditorium. There will be an Open House at 10:30 a.m. There will also be a groundbreaking ceremony after the morning service for the new educational building. A special invitation is extended to all individuals affected by the tornado. FCA will be holding graduation exercises in the church auditorium on May 26th at 7 p.m. Construction on the new educational building is expected to be completed in time for classes to be held in the fall of 2018.
